## THE CHALLENGE MAKE WAVES FOR LOCAL HOSPICE CARE

Whether you brave an energising open water swim or opt for the lane of your local pool, swim your way and ensure local people living with a terminal diagnosis get the care and support they deserve. You'll have four months to get your lengths in and complete the challenge.

#### How far can I swim?

Inspired by Birmingham's waterways, you will be awarded with a digital badge celebrating a local reservoir for your chosen distance:

- **250m**: 10 lengths of a 25m pool (our junior challenge), equivalent to the distance of Edgbaston reservoir
- 1 mile: 64 lengths of a 25m pool, equivalent to the distance of Bartley Green reservoir
- 2 miles: 125 lengths of a 25m pool, equivalent to the distance of Aston reservoir
- **5k**: 200 lengths of a 25m pool, equivalent to the distance of Frankley reservoir
- 10k: 400 lengths of a 25m pool, equivalent to the distance of Lifford reservoir

### GETTING STARTED WITH YOUR FUNDRAISING

Getting sponsored and raising money for Birmingham Hospice is what really makes the difference for local people living with a terminal diagnosis.

#### Here's how your fundraising will help:

- £21 could buy a teddy bear with a recording of a loved one's voice for a bereaved child
- £56 pays for a bereavement support session to help a family member cope with the loss of a loved one
- £95 pays for a specialist bereavement support session to help a child coping with the loss of a loved one
- £166 covers the cost of a home visit from an occupational therapist
- £525 could pay for 24 hours of nursing support for a person being cared for on one of our Inpatient Units

#### Deciding how you'll be fundraising:

There are a number of ways to collect donations/sponsorship in support of Birmingham Hospice.

Online fundraising page: An online donation page is perhaps the easiest method for both you (to set up and collect the money) and for us (to receive the money). Research also shows that people give more online, so choosing this method can help to easily boost your fundraising total. There are lots of different platforms you can use to set up a fundraising donation page, but once you've signed up to the swim challenge, you will automatically have an Enthuse fundraising page set up for you. Using this is a really easy way to share your challenge with family, friends or co-workers and gather your sponsorship.

Paper sponsorship forms: You can also collect donations offline by using the sponsorship form provided in your pack. You can pay in these donations via our website, to our bank account, by post or in person. Please ensure you fill in your details and the name of the challenge on the form. Once you've sent in your donation and we've received donations from all the other challenge participants, we'll send you a thank you letter which you can share with the people who kindly supported you. Please note, this may take up to eight weeks.

Gift Aid: Did you know that, as a UK taxpayer, you can include Gift Aid when you donate? This means that an extra 25p for every £1 donated will be added at no cost to you! Don't forget to encourage anyone who is sponsoring you to tick the Gift Aid box!



If you're keen to maximise your fundraising efforts, here are few things you might like to consider.

**Remember**, the money you raise really can make a big difference to local people living with life-limiting illness, and their families.

Shout about it! Now you've decided on how you're going to fundraise, it's time to shout about your incredible challenge! Whatever you're preferred communication method, make sure everyone you know is aware of what you're doing. You can text, call, share it on social media, or a good old fashioned face-to-face catch up will also do the trick!

Get off to a flying start: Ask a family member or someone you think might pledge a lot of money to make your first donation, as this will encourage others to follow suit and donate a similar amount.

**Get personal**: Personalise your fundraising page by uploading photos and telling people about the event and why you are taking part.

**Boost your funds:** Check if your company offers a match funding scheme, as this could instantly double your efforts.

And lastly, enjoy yourself. Be sure to let us know how you are getting on during this challenge and your training. Make sure you take lots of photos and share these with friends and us, as we would love to see how you are doing and potentially use these images in future marketing materials.
